Mr. Banks:

While the Volusia County Sheriff Department (VCSO) did investigate the

death of Tracey Veira — we believe that Investigator Campanella failed

to follow up on his initial documented suspicions that Ms. Veria state

of decomp was not consistent with the correctional officers documented observations of her.

As you are aware — Inmate Veira was on a special medical watch.

We suspect that the VCSO's investigation was improperly influenced by

(family) conflict of interest between the VCSO and the Volusia County legal department.

We also hold the opinion that the falsification of official records is

not simply "inaccurate reporting and dereliction of duty" as indicated

in your response.

Rather they are violations of FLORIDA law, requiring the attention of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and not the FBI. That these violation of Florida Law "implicates members of the corrections department in the intentional commission of acts which" facilitated the

death of Inmate Veira.

We ask FDLE to investigate these matters as it did in the following similar circumstances:
