Mr. Voges:

Please consider this as a follow up to the December 2, 2010 email.

Apparently, JNC Commissioner Jolley's spouse is a high ranking member of the Volusia County Sheriff Department (VCSO).

As you should be aware of, Candidate Jones' spouse (Major Robert Jones) is also a high ranking member of the VCSO.

Further, JNC records will indicate that Volusia County Sheriff Ben Johnson supplied the JNC with a glowing letter of recommendation.

Commissioner Jolley states in her email of November 4, 2010 (in the public domain - therefore, a public statement?) that her support of Candidate Jones' is due to her FOUR months of work experience with the candidate. The above situation could suggest that Commissioner Jolley's support is an in kind support driven by her husband's association with the VCSO / Sheriff Ben Johnson. (politically / financially biased?). As stated in the earlier email, Commissioner Jolley's email appears to violate JNC ethics rules / regulations.

It is noted that during the 2008 election cycle, records indicate that Mr. Jolley gave a political donation to the Johnson campaign.

During the October 20th, 2010 JNC interview, Candidate Jones apparently assured the JNC that her relationship with Commissioner Jolley was not significant. Evidence now suggest that this relationship could be the catalyst of a substantial conflict of interest. Further, during the commission interview, Candidate Jones assured the JNC that she did NOT have an open Florida Bar complaint. However, it is suggested that there was (is) a(n) open Florida Bar complaint on file during that time frame.

We request that you investigate these matters in your official capacity as the Chair of the Seventh Judicial Circuit's JNC.
