

Witness Statement

EE – Erik Eagan TT – Tom Tatum JV – Sgt. Jacob Vaughn (FHP)

EE Alright, the recorder is on. This will be taped interview in reference to Internal Affairs case number IA-13-024. Today's date is November 7, 2013 and the time is 1523 hours. The location of the interview is Internal Affairs office at the Sheriff's administration building in Deland, FL. Presently being interviewed is Jacob Vaughn, excuse me, is Sgt. Jacob Vaughn. Also, present is Sgt. Tom Tatum with the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Internal Affairs unit. I am Lt. Erik Eagan also with the Internal Affairs unit. Sgt. Vaughn are you aware that this interview is being recorded?

JV Yes.

EE As a Florida Law Enforcement Officer and Notary Public of the state of Florida I am empowered take sworn statements. At this time I ask you raise your right hand to be sworn. Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the statement you're about to give is the truth the whole truth and nothing but the truth so help you God?

JV Yes I do.

EE Well first off I want to thank you for meeting with us today. Could you spell your first and last name for the record please?

JV J-A-C-O-B, V-A-U-G-H-N.

EE Alright and how long have you worked for the Florida Highway Patrol?

JV About twelve years.

EE Alright. And what assignments have you held within the Florida Highway Patrol?

JV Uh, I was assigned to Orlando, coming out of the academy on the road. I went from there to the DUI squad. I worked on the DUI squad for about 5 years. From there I went to K-9 and went on to Brevard County. I worked there for 3 ½ years and I got promoted to sergeant and uh came to the I-4 squad where I've been for the last year or so.

EE Ok. And what are your current work hours?

JV 2 pm to 10 pm.

EE Do you recall what your work hours were on November 5, 2013?

47 JV 2 pm to 10 pm.
48
49 EE Alright. Do you have any specialized training in traffic crash investigations?
50
51 JV Uh no just the standard trooper training.
52
53 EE And how much training is that?
54
55 JV Basic crash investigation.
56
57 EE Is that...
58
59 JV That's not a reconstruction or anything like that.
60
61 EE ...is it forty hours?
62
63 JV I think it was a forty hour block in the academy yeah.
64
65 EE Ok. Do you have any additional law enforcement experience?
66
67 JV No.
68
69 EE Alright. As I mentioned off the record I'm conducting this administrative
70 investigation in regards to allegations against Deputy Andrew Oliver for not being
71 truthful with his sergeant, not being truthful with a law enforcement officer to wit
72 you, Sgt. Jacob Vaughn with the Florida Highway Patrol, for making a false
73 police report to you, and falsification of official documents and that occurred on
74 November 5, 2013. Do you recall a traffic crash that you investigated on
75 November 5, 2013 on County Road 4155, which is also Providence Blvd just
76 south of Alley 500 in Deltona, FL?
77
78 JV Yes sir.
79
80 EE Ok. And did that crash involve a Volusia County Sheriff's office vehicle?
81
82 JV Yes sir.
83
84 EE Ok. Could you tell me who requested you to investigate this traffic crash?
85
86 JV The trooper that was on scene um she had called me and told me that she was
87 having some difficulties determining what had occurred and so she requested that
88 I would come up there.
89
90 EE I just wanted you to lift it up. It kind of...
91
92 JV (inaudible)

93
94 EE ...messes up the recording. Ok. Do you know who originally called the trooper
95 that called you? Was it the Volusia County Sheriff's office?
96
97 JV Do I know? I'm sorry can you repeat that.
98
99 EE Do you know who called the trooper that requested you to the scene? Do you
100 know if it was the Volusia County Sheriff's?
101
102 JV I, I don't know if you, if the Sheriff's office called our dispatch or if it was
103 somebody else. I don't know.
104
105 EE Ok. Could you tell me about that investigation that you conducted that day
106 involving the Sheriff's office vehicle?
107
108 JV Um, sure. I arrived on scene and um spoke with the trooper that had been on
109 scene, um, she again kind of gave me information that she had as far as
110 passengers and uh information like that. Handed me the license, registration,
111 insurance for the cars. I then spoke, or spoke, I believe I spoke with the deputy
112 first. I observed the deputies vehicle um after speaking with him. I went and
113 spoke with the driver of the BMW and then I spoke with the driver of the Honda.
114
115 EE And when you interviewed Deputy Oliver, what did he tell you happened?
116
117 JV He told me he was driving south on Providence. He was in the inside lane, in
118 which he clarified that to be the left lane um and that the BMW was in the right
119 lane. The Honda was behind the BMW in the right land and um he said that the
120 BMW was I guess slowing or turning into a driveway. The Honda swerved to the
121 left and um struck the back of the BMW and then also struck the right front of the
122 patrol car.
123
124 EE Ok. And based on the information that you had, what was your analysis of
125 Deputy Oliver's testimony to you?
126
127 JV Um, at the conclusion of my investigation?
128
129 EE Yes sir.
130
131 JV Um, that what he was telling me was not what occurred.
132
133 EE What did you base your analysis on? Was it on physical evidence, additional
134 witnesses?
135
136 JV Uh, it was physical evidence. It was the testimony of both the other drivers that
137 were involved um so basically that was.
138

139 EE Ok. Did you question Deputy Oliver about the inconsistencies with his
140 explanation?
141

142 JV Um, no not really. I, I ah pointed out the evidence that showed me how I knew
143 um what he was telling me was not correct um just dealing with his demeanor, he
144 didn't seem like the uh, I didn't want to make it to be a bigger issue at that point,
145 um, he didn't seem to be very. I mean, I understand he had just been in a crash.
146 He didn't seem to be very uh, um cordial. And uh the more I talked to him and
147 explained what was going on, he seemed to, I could see the stress kind of build up
148 in him, so I didn't, didn't really feel the need to push that anymore.
149

150 EE Ok.
151

152 TT Would you express his demeanor as confrontational?
153

154 JV I wouldn't say it was confrontational. I would just say he uh I could just see the,
155 the, the muscles on the side, on his jaw clenching um and just had a, I didn't want
156 it to get to be confrontational; I guess is more of what I'm trying to say. He didn't
157 say anything that would that, that concerned me. But it was just his demeanor. I
158 just didn't want to push it.
159

160 EE Body language?
161

162 JV Correct.
163

164 EE Ok. So you didn't discuss with him about the perceived lie that he told you?
165

166 JV Well, I, like I said I discussed with him, um, the evidence that showed me that
167 basically he was lying. I didn't say those words, but um, I, I wanted him to know
168 that I knew that he wasn't telling me the truth without actually coming out and
169 directly confronting him about.
170

171 EE Ok. So basically you did it in a professional manner? In a way where you didn't
172 have to call him liar?
173

174 JV That was my intention.
175

176 EE Ok.
177

178 TT Did you talk to his sergeant about his statement?
179

180 JV Yes.
181

182 TT Did you express your concerns with what Deputy Oliver had told you had
183 occurred in the crash?
184

185 JV Yes um and uh he was there when I was actually talking to Deputy Oliver and
186 kind of showing him, showing him what the evidence showed me and that how I
187 knew that his statements were not correct.
188
189 EE Ok. Did Deputy Oliver change his story in any manner?
190
191 JV Not to me. No.
192
193 EE No slight variations?
194
195 JV No, I didn't, not to me. He did not.
196
197 EE Ok. Do you know who he did change his story with?
198
199 JV Well, the, the um trooper who was on the scene had mentioned something to me
200 on the phone before I got there but he had been concrete in his statement and then
201 at some point he seemed to kind of get a little wishy washy I think is what she
202 described it as. But I don't know exactly what that was.
203
204 EE Ok. And I don't recall, did you mention the trooper's name?
205
206 JV In my report?
207
208 EE That...
209
210 JV Or in the?
211
212 EE No in...
213
214 JV I, no, I, I'd, I believe I gave her name to the sergeant that was out there because he
215 asked...
216
217 EE Ok.
218
219 JV ...um, but I...
220
221 EE Would you mind providing it to us?
222
223 JV Her name's Heather Ganem.
224
225 EE How do you spell her last name?
226
227 JV G-A-N-E-M.
228
229 EE Now is she out of the Deland...
230

231 JV Yes sir.
232
233 EE ...troop?
234
235 JV MmmHmm.
236
237 EE Ok. Does she work the same shift as you?
238
239 JV Yes sir.
240
241 EE Ok. Now you've been a law enforcement officer for twelve plus years, when you
242 explain to somebody that the information that they've given you is not factual
243 based on the evidence and based on other peoples testimony, what is a normal
244 reaction? Or is there?
245
246 JV Well, I mean, I've had people that they don't, there story is still the same and
247 they're going to dig their heels in. I also have the opposite where people will,
248 when confronted with evidence will um be more truthful.
249
250 EE Ok. Based on again, your twelve years of law enforcement training and
251 experience, do you believe Deputy Oliver was untruthful with you during your
252 traffic crash investigation?
253
254 JV Uh yes.
255
256 EE Would you characterize his false testimony as making a false police report of a
257 traffic crash?
258
259 JV Um, I, I guess so, I, I don't know how else you would describe it.
260
261 EE Ok. Do you think Deputy Oliver lied to you?
262
263 JV Yes.
264
265 EE Did he have anything to gain by lying to you?
266
267 JV Um, maybe not receiving a ticket. I don't know, what all, whatever the process,
268 procedure for your agency is when somebody gets in an at fault crash.
269
270 EE So he did have some sort of motivation to lie?
271
272 JV I would believe so, yes.
273
274 EE Ok. You mentioned that you interviewed the two other drivers; did you interview
275 anybody else other than the trooper that initially responded?
276

277 JV No sir.
278
279 EE Ok. I guess there were two vehicle passengers?
280
281 JV Correct.
282
283 EE Is it normal not to interview them...
284
285 JV Um...
286
287 EE ...or had the trooper interviewed them?
288
289 JV ...in my, in my experience there's nothing gained from that because they're,
290 they're not independent. They're gonna say the same thing as, as the driver...
291
292 EE Ok.
293
294 JV ...um so they weren't an independent witness.
295
296 EE Ok. And you weren't aware of any independent witnesses to the traffic crash?
297
298 JV Right. I asked Trooper Ganem if she knew of any and she said no she didn't
299 know of any.
300
301 EE Ok. Alright. What did the driver 1 Rodriguez tell you about the crash?
302
303 JV Um, Rodriguez was the BMW driver?
304
305 EE I believe so.
306
307 JV Yes. Um, Mr. Rodriguez told me he was slowing down and turning into the
308 parking lot of Little Caesars which is right there where the crash occurred on
309 Providence um he, as he was slowing down, he um I think he said he heard the
310 tires squealing and he felt the impact. He looked to his left and he saw the
311 deputy's patrol car at an angle next to him um and then he said he felt the second
312 impact from the other car. I asked him how he knew that the deputy had hit him
313 first because he, that's when he told me that after the first impact he looked to see
314 what had happened and then he saw the deputy, like I said at the angle next him.
315 In the lane directly next to him um and then he felt the second impact.
316
317 EE Ok. What about the driver of the blue Honda, Christian Rivera, what did he tell
318 you about the crash?
319
320 JV Uh, he told me he was traveling um behind the deputy. He had been traveling
321 behind the deputy for; I think he said 3 miles um in the outside lane. The deputy

322 suddenly swerved in front of him to the left um he then saw the BMW that was
323 ahead and he hit the brakes and swerved to the left but he hit the BMW.
324
325 EE Who did you find at fault for the traffic crash?
326
327 JV Um, both Deputy Oliver and Mr. Rivera were both issued citations.
328
329 EE What did you charge Deputy Oliver with?
330
331 JV Careless driving.
332
333 EE Ok. And I also saw that you had an additional notation on your traffic citation,
334 inattentiveness resulting in an offset rear-end collision.
335
336 JV Correct.
337
338 EE Ok. Does that qualify the charge of careless driving? Is that why the additional
339 comments on there?
340
341 JV Right. It's for the court house (unintelligible).
342
343 EE Ok.
344
345 JV Some court house jurisdictions, careless driving is kind of a broad statute so they
346 just want a little more...
347
348 EE Ok.
349
350 JV ...specificity.
351
352 EE And the charge of careless driving that Deputy Oliver was cited for is violation of
353 Florida state statute 316.1925(1)?
354
355 JV Correct.
356
357 EE Was Mr. Rivera, was he cited for the same traffic violation as Deputy Oliver?
358
359 JV Yes sir.
360
361 EE And the actual crashes were very similar in nature, is that why you cited them?
362
363 JV Right, they, I mean, they were pretty much had the same fact pattern, the same
364 damage. The only thing different was the damage to Deputy Oliver's vehicle was
365 not nearly as uh major as the damage to the Honda.
366

367 EE Ok. Were you given an opportunity before this interview to read Deputy Oliver's
368 police report?
369
370 JV Yes sir.
371
372 EE Ok. And I do have it here for reference. In Deputy Oliver's statement in his
373 police report, which is referenced by Volusia County Sheriff's office case number
374 13-30771, Deputy Oliver wrote that he was traveling on the inside lane, again
375 based on your investigation and your interviews of those involved, is that a factual
376 statement in Deputy Oliver's police report?
377
378 JV Um, at the time of the crash that he, no he was not traveling in the inside lane.
379
380 EE Ok. He also wrote the black BMW was traveling in the outside lane and the blue
381 Honda followed behind, is that factual and truthful?
382
383 JV Um, no.
384
385 EE Ok. Was there blue or black transferred paint on Deputy Oliver's patrol car, do
386 you recall? And I do have some...
387
388 JV Right.
389
390 EE ...photographs here as reference.
391
392 JV There was both. There was blue and black transfer markings.
393
394 EE Could you assess the transferred paint and identify how that paint got on Deputy
395 Oliver's patrol car?
396
397 JV Yes.
398
399 EE Could you explain...
400
401 JV Sure...
402
403 EE ...for the record please?
404
405 JV ...um, well the, the way that I determined how that transfer came to be was uh
406 trying to match up Deputy Oliver's statements that the blue Honda is what caused
407 that um I basically all I did was get out a tape measure and measured the heights
408 from the ground that those markings um were. I measured that with the, there
409 was some damage to the left front of the Honda, um so I measured that up with
410 that, um, they were not consistent. The damage to the Honda, the markings
411 started I think around uh 8 to 9 inches um Deputy Oliver's was I believe 15-16
412 inches or somewhere in there um Mr. Rivera had stated to me that the damage to

413 the left front of his Honda had happened from a, hitting a concrete pole inside of a
414 parking garage, um so I measured the distance, I measured also the distance on
415 the left rear of the BMW um and that the height matched almost perfectly with the
416 markings on Deputy Oliver's patrol car. Also on Deputy Oliver's patrol car you
417 would see a blue streak at the top, closer to the headlight, underneath that was a
418 black streak um so and then I, so I looked at both vehicles. The blue Honda had
419 nothing on the left front that would have cause a black mark um but the left rear
420 of the BMW had the blue bumper with a black molding, which in pictures you can
421 is, was taken off partially in the crash. Um, and that matched up exactly with the,
422 those the paint transfer to the patrol car matched up exactly with the left rear
423 bumper of the BMW.
424
425 EE Ok. So the blue transferred paint came from the rear bumper of the black BM,
426 excuse me, of the blue BMW?
427
428 JV Right. The BMW was blue. It was a darker blue, but it was blue.
429
430 EE Ok. And then the black transfer came from the bumper molding...
431
432 JV Correct.
433
434 EE ...on the black, excuse me, blue BMW?
435
436 JV Correct.
437
438 EE Ok.
439
440 JV Also, I didn't, I need to add that um the damage to the bumper of the deputy's car
441 actually wrapped around the front somewhat, um so from my experience, if it
442 happened as he had stated to me where the car came into his lane, um and hit
443 there and then rubbed all the way down the, the side of the car, the headlight
444 would have had damage just because of the impact would have been more um...
445
446 EE Lateral?
447
448 JV Correct. Would have been into the car more as opposed to, coming forward,
449 glancing off the left rear of the BMW.
450
451 EE Ok. And just to clarify, I know I've screwed this up twice, was the BMW blue or
452 black?
453
454 JV It was blue.
455
456 EE Ok and you said it was a dark blue?
457
458 JV A darker blue, yes.

459
460 EE Now what is your degree of certainty in your professional opinion of your
461 findings of this traffic crash investigation?
462
463 JV Uh, I'm 100% confident.
464
465 EE Ok. Was there any additional physical evidence, other than what we discussed?
466 Was there any broken tail lenses or anything like that, which would also reconcile
467 your findings?
468
469 JV Um, no. Can I just back up to the previous question real quick?
470
471 EE Yes sir.
472
473 JV Um, when I say I'm 100% confident in my findings, meaning that, um, this
474 damage is from this car, um which lanes they were in, there was no skid marks in
475 the road so that's going straight off of witnesses...
476
477 EE Witness testimony.
478
479 JV ...so, I'm 100% confident that this damage to the right front of the patrol car
480 came from the left rear of the BMW.
481
482 EE Ok. Is there anything additional that you think would be helpful to our
483 investigation?
484
485 JV I don't think so.
486
487 EE Ok. Did you witness Deputy Oliver talking to Sgt. Whitener, who was the
488 supervisor on scene from the Sheriff's office?
489
490 JV When I arrived on scene they appeared to be talking.
491
492 EE Ok, but did you actually hear any of their conversations?
493
494 JV No sir.
495
496 EE Ok. Anything else?
497
498 TT Did Deputy Oliver argue about the citation at all with you?
499
500 JV No.
501
502 TT So, he was issued the citation and signed it?
503
504 JV He didn't, well we don't have to sign 'em anymore so...



506 TT Oh ok.
507
508 JV ...um, so he didn't sign it. I just handed it to him. I gave him the, you know, we
509 all know how to handle it, so um there wasn't much discussion about it, I guess.
510
511 EE Ok. Let me ask you this, based on your twelve years experience, when you hand
512 somebody a citation and they accept it but there telling you the complete opposite
513 of your findings, would they normally argue that point?
514
515 JV I mean, I, some people do, some people don't. It's, I think some people
516 understand that there's a process for arguing the ticket, its court...
517
518 EE Ok.
519
520 JV ...you get them both ways.
521
522 EE Alright, is there anything from your statement here today that you'd like to add or
523 delete?
524
525 JV No sir.
526
527 EE Ok. As this investigation is continuing you are requested not to discuss the details
528 of this investigation except with legal council or your personal representative and
529 we ask that to maintain the integrity of the investigation so that people aren't
530 talking about it. Alright, do you understand that?
531
532 JV Yes sir.
533
534 EE Alright the time is 15:49 hours and this will conclude the interview. Thank you.
